

- The recently established Graduate Institute of Library, Information and Archival Studies, along with the Graduate Institute of Religious Studies, and the Graduate Institutes of Taiwan History and Taiwanese Literature aim to enhance scholarly research and the spirit of humanities.
- The College of Liberal Arts promotes teacher and student exchanges through academic cooperation agreements with 51 outstanding international universities. Besides, the College of Liberal Arts is also known for its foreign student-friendly curriculum aimed at encouraging the study of Chinese language and culture.
- CFLL provides students with rigorous training in 16 foreign languages, literatures, and cultures.
- Endeavoring to integrate theory with practice, CFFL encourages students to learn languages and combine their technical expertise with language proficiency for cross-cultural activities and learning.

College of Law



- The first independent law school of all national universities in Taiwan.
- Offers one undergraduate program, one executive master's program, and eight specialized research centers (Centers in Public Law, Civil Law, Criminal Law, Economic & Financial Law, Labor & Social Law, China Law Studies, Fundamental Jurisprudence, and Interdisciplinary Studies)—the College of Law is now the largest and most influential law school in Taiwan.

- Established in 1927, the College of Social Sciences integrates experts from 10 departments, 3 international master's programs, and 10 research centers to train talent that can serve the country, conduct frontier research, and provide professional consulting services for the public.
- With nearly 70% of faculty members having graduated from renowned universities across Europe and the US, the CSS encourages students to participate in over 50 English-taught courses, international exchange, and community service programs for a holistic academic experience.

College of Education



- Founded in 1954, the College of Education is the first educational institute to be established in Taiwan.
- Offers a multitude of courses focusing on secondary education, education administration and student affairs, educational research and leadership, and multicultural education.
- Besides regular programs, we also established one and the only national center, funded by the Ministry of Education, Taiwan Experimental Educational Center (TEEC) in 2015 and is extending its influence on innovative schooling and pedagogy.



Housing

Safe & clean on-campus accommodations with great amenities

There are 3 main dormitory areas at NCCU. Two are located on-campus, while NCCU-iHouse (dormitory for international exchange students) is located off-campus, 5-min away from the NCCU main campus by foot. Room types range from single to 4-person room, depending on the availability of each dormitory. Dorm fees fall between USD300-USD1100 per semester. All dormitories are separated by gender, and residents are required to follow access control during certain periods to ensure their safety. Smoking and cooking are both prohibited in all NCCU dormitories. However, the use of microwaves and ovens are allowed in public areas.





Sports Facilities

Most facilities are free to use, but require prereservation . 


